#### Pastor's Corner

I'm sure you were expecting my October newsletter article to be all about stewardship. After all, that's what we've been talking about through all of September. And that was my original plan. But as important as it is to talk about the gifts we give to support the ministries of this church, I found a topic that was even more important when I was at leadership institute. It's a series that was offered to all attending churches by Adam Hamilton.

This topic centers around a rule. THE rule actually. Jesus talks about it as he ties up his Sermon on the Mount. In Matthew 7:12 he says this, "In everything do to others as you would have them do to you, for this is the Law and the Prophets." Today we know this as The Golden Rule. Most of us would be able to recite this rule. But isn't hard to put it in practice? Jesus sure said hard things.

That's why for the rest of October and the first Sunday in November we will be going over 4 of the different aspects of this rule of all rules. This will take us up to the election, a place that makes following this rule more difficult than ever. By looking at these aspects of the Golden Rule, perhaps we might find ourselves equipped against divisiveness and anxiety.

The 4 aspects of the Golden Rule that we will cover are: Kindness, Compassion, Respect, and Love. We won't have time to talk about humility, but I will cover that in one of my weekly devotions.

We will find words of wisdom from Luke, Isaiah, Paul, and Matthew. And let's remember that Jesus lived in very turbulent times. If it wasn't the Pharisees and Sadducees, it was the Romans who were wreaking havoc on those living in Israel at the time.

As tumultuous as those times were, Jesus was still able to look at things differently. He called his disciples and us to imagine a world where we treat each other generously. Where we know what it feels like to live in generous love.

# A Message from Our Lay Leader Points to Ponder

Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you. Cleanse your hands, sinners, and purify your hearts, you double-minded. James 4:8

The Gullah Geechee culture is a unique African American heritage that developed in the coastal regions of the southeastern U.S., particularly in the Lowcountry regions of South Carolina, Georgia and parts of Florida. The people there were isolated from other cultures, and developed a language that combines English with western African words and traditions. This mixture of sounds and rhythms has created some beautiful songs and stories. One such song is recognized by us as Kumbaya (Come By Here).

The origin of the song is unknown, but was first recorded by folklorist Robert Winslow Gordon in 1926. Gordon traveled around the country, looking for local cultures and songs that were disappearing in the 20<sup>th</sup> century with the advent of mass media like radio. While on a trip to Georgia, Gordon used his Edison recording machine to make wax cylinders of several songs in the Gullah dialect by a Gullah singer only known as H. Wylie. One stood out for its simplicity, beauty and message, Kumbaya.

Kumbaya is a simple plea for God to be with us in our tough times. "Someone's crying Lord, Come by here." During the turbulent protest times of the 1950s and 60s, Kumbaya became a plea for divine intervention on behalf of oppressed people. It was a message that said, "We are hurting, Lord, and we need to feel that you are near us." I remember singing this song around campfires at church camps in the 60s and 70s. Then, somewhere along the way, Kumbaya came to be mocked. The song became tied to unrealistic expectations. Politicians and others used it as a way of saying that things were tough, and the problems of this world are not easily settled. "These things will not be solved by having us all sit around a campfire, roasting marshmallows and singing Kumbaya." While that may be true for complex issues, it is also true that we need God's presence, especially in trying times.

James reminds us that if we draw near to God, God will draw closer to us. How do we do this? Through getting back to living the way God wants us to and expects us to as his children. We have God's promise to never leave us or forsake us, so if we don't feel close to God, we can know that it is us who have pulled away. The verses in Kumbaya starts with, "someone's crying, Lord," to "someone's praying, Lord" to "someone's singing, Lord." If we want to move from the crying to the singing we need to remember to do the praying! May we all feel the presence of God in our lives, today and always.

### A Message from Our Finance Director

Blessings to you all,

Here is the monthly financial report for the month of August, general fund giving for the month was \$11,167.05, compared to last year, which was \$10,231.49. Miscellaneous income for the month was \$312.99 compared to last August which was \$491.06. Total income for August 2024 was \$11,480.04 compared to last year, which was \$10,650.55. As you can see, we are slightly above in giving from where we were in last year.

Our general fund income for the year through August 31, 2024, was \$95,234.49 compared to last year, which was \$111,912.17. We are down \$16,677.68 from last year's giving, this time last year. Total revenue for this year through August 31, 2024, was \$120,825.50 compared to last year which was \$185,219.68. Although August revenue is up this year, our revenue for the year is quite a bit lower than last year, with a difference of \$-64,394.18. Our profit and loss report shows that we have a negative net balance of \$69,264.54 for the year through August 31.

Please be in prayer about how much you might be able to increase your giving. God is faithful to provide, especially if He asks you to trust Him with your finances.




