Pastor's Corner

A few years ago, a team was assembled here to look at ways to improve effectiveness in our ministries. One of the gifts that came out of these sessions was a new purpose statement for St. John's. Here is that purpose statement:

To Welcome and affirm all people to experience the love of God.

Learn together to follow the example of Jesus, and

Work to be a blessing to our community and the world.

These words create a beautiful and powerful way for anyone to enter our doors, become part of the church family, and become part of the ministry of St. John's.

You might not have noticed, but recently I started making the action words of this purpose statement a part of the benediction each week. Welcoming, Learning, and Working. That is what we are about at St. John's.

This may or may not be a surprise to you. Most pastors, including myself, plan out sermons several weeks or months in advance. Some actually plan out a whole year in one setting. I'm not there yet. But I find planning very helpful. Instead of wondering what I will preach about each week, I wonder about messaging. How do I take these themes, verses, and songs that spoke to me during my planning, and bring them to life in our worship services. One thing to know about me is I rarely change from what I've planned. I trust that God, during planning, gave me what was needed for the here and now.

I diverted that for the first time in my ministerial life after attending Leadership Institute. What we heard there led to our current series, "Do Unto Others". Four weeks for topics starting on October 13th and ending on November 3rd. This left me with a problem though. Advent starts on December 1st. That meant only 3 weeks between the end of our current series and the start of Advent. What in the world could I meaningfully cover in just 3 weeks? I agonized and agonized.

Then it hit me. I wondered how much you all knew about our new purpose statement. Those who knew could always know more. Those who didn't know, it's high time they did. Remember how many lines are in the purpose statement. (Pst...look back at the top) There are 3 lines. 3 separate themes. Wait...I need a 3-week sermon series.

A Message from Our Lay Leader Points to Ponder

"Are not two sparrows sold for a copper coin? And not one of them falls to the ground apart from your Father's will." Matthew 10:29

Many of the stories and truths Jesus told his followers had to do with nature. Maybe he wanted to make the stories relatable; most of the folks he talked to were in close surroundings to nature. I think he also wanted to remind people that the Kingdom of God was not in some far off land, but all around them if they just looked and listened. Many of the proverbs and parables were about birds. I'm sure that birds didn't seem too important to the people. They weren't valued as work animals. Although some were perhaps appreciated for their singing, most people probably thought of them as pests and nuisances, if they thought of them at all. Did Jesus want to make a connection between the least seen parts of society and their value to the Father, or was he just a bird watcher?

A favorite song in my family growing up was His Eye is on the Sparrow. My mom especially loved the version sung by George Beverly Shea, who was best known for bringing music to the Billy Graham Crusades. His Eye is on the Sparrow was written by Civilla Durfee Martin, a Canadian gospel writer. She also penned another great song of faith, God Will Take Care of You. The words to "Sparrow" came to her after meeting an older Christian couple, one where the wife had been bedridden for over twenty years and the husband could only get around with the help of a wheelchair. How could these people who were suffering remain in positive spirits and not blame God for their misfortunes? The wife had put it this way to Civilla Martin, "His eye is on the sparrow, so I know that He will take care of me."

"Why should I feel discouraged? Why should the shadows come? Why should my heart be lonely, and long for heaven and home? With Jesus is my portion, my constant friend is He. His eye is on the sparrow, and I know he cares for me. I sing because I'm happy. I sing because I'm free! For His eye is on the sparrow, and I know He watches me."

It's easy to get down, to feel discouraged, to think that no one cares what happens to us. But here's the Good News: we have a Heavenly Father who watches over all His Creation. If he cares about something as little and insignificant as a small bird, how much more must He care about and love us? We are not alone! Thanks be to God! Make that your song of praise, and as the singing birds reflect God's glory, let our voices do the same. Not only will that song bring joy to God, but it might also make a difference to other little birds around you. May we each have an attitude of gratitude!



Presto chango, we have a sermon series. I'm calling this brief series "We are:". Each week we will talk about an aspect of our purpose statement. By the time we are done, I hope you will know this statement well enough to both say it and consider how we can live it.

Where will we seek help from? Scripture of course. Matthew will help us discuss the idea of "Welcoming." King Solomon in Proverbs will help us with "Learning". And finally, Paul will help us dig into "Working".

Welcoming, Learning, and Working. That's who we are! Join me in the journey of learning more about what these mean for us and for the community we serve.

A Message from Our Finance Director

Blessings to you all,

Here is the monthly financial report for the month of September. General fund giving for the month was \$12,652.68, compared to last year, which was \$10250.79. Miscellaneous income for the month was \$465.88 compared to last year, which was \$335.74. Total income for September 2024 was 13,118.56 compared to last year, which was \$10,586.53. Though giving is up from last year, net income for the month is still negative at \$10,360.95

Our general fund income for the year through September 2024, was \$107,887.17 compared to last year, which was 122,162.96. We are down \$14,275.79 from last year's giving. Total revenue for this year through September 30, 2024, was \$133,944.06 compared to last year's \$160,806.21. Our profit and loss report shows that we have a negative net income of \$79,518.87 for the year through September 2024.


I wanted to share my morning devotion with you, it was titled Generosity and Provision (and was on the youversion bible app). The scripture was Malachi 3:10, which reads, "Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this 'says the Lord Almighty, 'and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that there will not be room, enough to store it." The storehouse in ancient Isreal was a place in the temple where tithes and offerings were kept, primarily to provide for the priests and the needy. This was God's lesson to them about stewardship and caring for people in their community. Their generosity was a way of loving and serving those around them. Today we also give to the church to support the ministries of the church but also to keep the lights on, so that we can continue to serve the community. This verse prompts us to examine our own generosity. Are we trusting God with all we have or are we holding back with as tightly closed fist? Stewardship is not only about generosity, but about faith. Do you have a "have to" mentality when it comes to giving, or do you have an I "get to" mentality.






