Pastor's Corner

Last month we discussed on an introductory level the concept of Lay Servant ministry. The first step in becoming a Lay Servant is to become a Certified Lay Servant. This month I want to talk about to additional areas of Lay Servanthood, Lay Speaker, and Lay Minister.

What does a Certified Lay Speaker do? It's all laid out in our Book of Discipline. ¶267. I won't make you read it though. Aren't I nice? In addition to all that you might be asked to do as a Certified Lay Minister, you would also become available to PREACH! These requests might come from me, or a District Superintendent, or the committee on Lay Servant Ministries.

What do I need to do to become a Certified Lay Speaker? I'm glad you asked! Here are the requirements:

- Be certified as a lay servant (or equivalent as defined by his or her central conference)
- Received Pastor and church council or charge conference recommendation.
- Complete track of study as defined in ¶267.3.
 - Leading Worship
 - Leading Prayer
 - Discovering Spiritual Gifts
 - Preaching
 - United Methodist Heritage and Polity

Be approved by our Conference committee on Lay Servant Ministries approval after interview with and recommendation from the district committee on Lay Servant Ministries

Once I become a Certified Lay Speaker, how do I maintain that? Again, I'm glad you asked! Here you go:

- Submit Annual report & renewal application.
- Pastor and church council or charge conference recommendation (part of our annual church conference)
- Lay Servant Ministries advanced course in the last three years
- Conference committee on Lay Servant Ministries approval every three years after interview with and recommendation from the district committee on Lay Servant Ministries

Let's move on to talk about becoming a Certified Lay Minister. If you are someone who feels a call to ministry but doesn't have time and money for education or cannot be itinerant (able to move to serve as clergy anywhere you are sent), this could be an avenue for you.

Points to Ponder

Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before him he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.

Hebrews 12:1-2

Helen Lemmel was born in England in 1863, but her family moved to Wisconsin when she was still a baby. Helen's dad was a Wesleyan Methodist minister, and Helen grew up with music and the Scriptures all around her. When she was in her early twenties, she was able to go to Germany and hone her musical abilities with some of the best musical masters of the day. On her return to America, her voice and beauty led to many invitations to sing in the opera and orchestra halls around the country. Helen was inspired to use her talents in other, more church-related ways, so she took a position of music teacher at the famous Moody Bible Institute of Chicago. There, she taught hundreds of students who were training for ministry. She eventually wrote over 500 hymns, and many children's songs as well.

Her best remembered piece was written in 1918. While visiting a friend, she read a piece by a missionary to Africa. One line read, "So then, turn your eyes upon Him, look full into His face, and the things of this world will acquire a strange new dimness." Immediately, a tune sprang into her mind, and she sat down and began composing the hymn we know as Turn Your Eyes Upon Jesus. "Oh soul, are you weary and troubled, no light in the darkness you see? There's light for a look at the Savior. And life more abundant and free. Turn your eyes upon Jesus. Look full in his wonderful face. And the things of earth will grow strangely dim, in the light of His glory and grace."

We all get "weary and troubled." There are times in everyone's life where it seems that the darkness is winning out over the light. When those times come, what are we doing? Are we letting ourselves be overwhelmed with grief or self-pity? Are we angrily cursing the darkness? Or are we turning our eyes toward Jesus? Our faith needs to be lived out in good times and in bad, but it is those times of trouble and suffering where we will choose to respond with anger, fear and despair, or with peace, perseverance, and hope.

We can't do this by ourselves. But we don't need to. We have Jesus, our Example and Guide. We have the Comforter, the Holy Spirit, and we have that Great Cloud of Witnesses, Christian family and friends who are all there to stretch out hands to pull us out of the struggle and back into God's light. The choice is always ours. I pray that you and I will always choose the light!

What does a Certified Lay Minister do? A certified lay minister serves as part of their local ministry team with the supervision and support of a clergy person. Their duties might include the following:

- Conduct public worship.
- Cares for the congregation
- Develop new faith communities.
- Preach the Word
- Leads small groups.
- Establish outreach ministries.
- Serve as a class leader.
- Assist in program leadership.
- Engage in specialized ministries after appropriate training such as in parish nursing, church planting, men's ministry, children's faith formation, congregational care, and more.

What are the requirements to become a Certified Lay Minister?

- Be Certified as a lay servant, lay missionary (or equivalent as defined by his or her central conference)
- Receive Pastor and church council or charge conference recommendation.
- Complete track of study as relevant to your assignment as defined by Discipleship Ministries or the National Plan for Hispanic/Latino Ministry in collaboration with Discipleship Ministries and the conference committee on Lay Servant Ministries or equivalent structure.
- District Superintendent recommendation
- Complete any appropriate screening & assessment.
- Receive approval from Conference committee on Lay Servant Ministries approval after interview with the district committee on Ordained Ministry. (DCOM)

Once I become a Certified Lay Speaker, how do I maintain that?

- Submit annual report.
- Receive Pastor and church council or charge conference recommendation (again, part of our annual church conference meeting)
- Complete a Ministry review.
- Completes Lay Servant Ministries advanced course or approved continuing education event every two years.
- Receive District Superintendent recommendation.
- Receive Conference committee on Lay Servant Ministries approval every two years after interview with and recommendation from district committee on Ordained Ministry

So that's it. That is the full scope of all of the ways to participate in Lay Servant Ministries. What's next? Sign up for the classes we are hosting this fall. The confirmed dates are November 1st and 2nd. We will be holding a Basic Course and an Advanced Course. The advanced course is on intercessory and public prayer. It would qualify for Lay Speaker training.

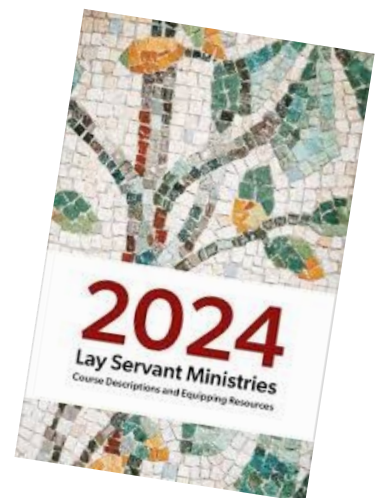

A Message from Our Finance Director

Blessings to you all,

I hope you enjoyed Pastor Amy's guest articles the last two months. We have been in the process of switching our finance software from a desktop version to an online version and it has been painfully long, but I think we finally have the transition sorted out! Apparently, you can teach an old dog new tricks, who knew?

Now that we have this all squared away, I can give you our financials for the month of July. General fund giving for the month of July was \$11,275.71, compared to last year, which was \$14,418.29. Miscellaneous income for the month of July was \$8056.49 compared to last July which was \$6022.21. Total income for July 2024 was \$19,332.20 compared to July 2023, which was \$20,438.50. As you can see, we are only slightly behind where our income was in July last year, but our general fund giving is down \$3,140.56 from last year. Our income to expenditures shows that we have a negative net income of **\$4,993.90** for the month of July 2024.

Our general fund income for the year through July 31, 2024, was \$84067.44 compared to last year, which was \$101,680.68. We are down \$17,613.24 from last year's giving. Total revenue for this year through July 31, 2024, was \$109,345.32. Our profit and loss report shows that we have a negative net balance of **\$57,860.31** for the year through July 31.

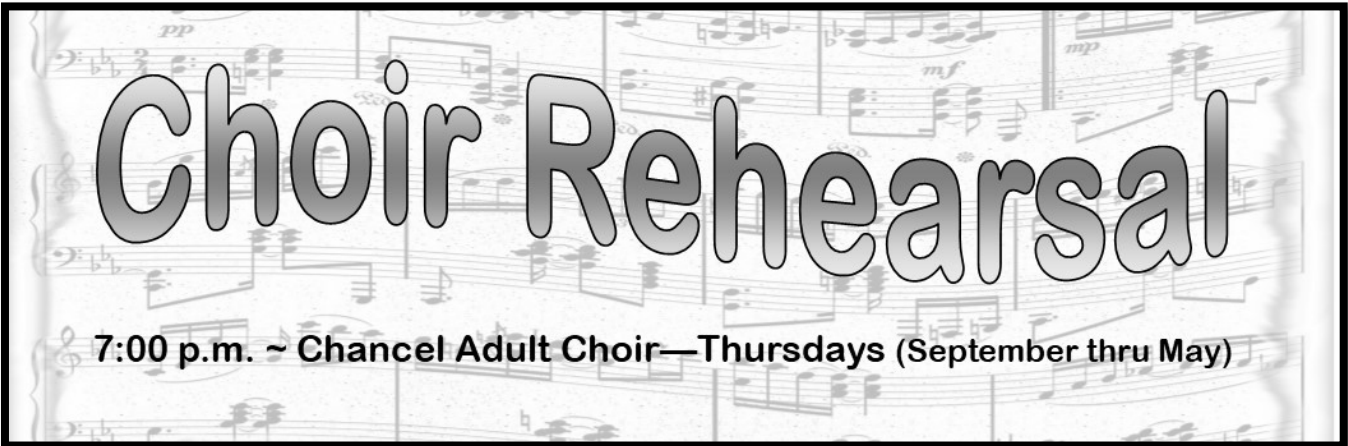
We have had many unforeseen repairs this year, such as a new air conditioner unit to cool Pastor Amy's and my offices and a repair for some electrical issues in the sanctuary, just to name a couple. This building is getting up there in age, so I suspect we will continue to see some other unplanned repair expenses. Also, as many of you know there was an increase in our electric bill and water rates have also gone up (as many of you are aware).

As I request in every newsletter article, please pray and ask for the Lord to guide your giving and see if maybe the \$50 dollar/month increase to your giving that Amy suggested in last month's article is something that He is asking you to do. I guarantee if He asks you to make this increase (or any other increase) and you obey his request, you will be blessed and so will the church.

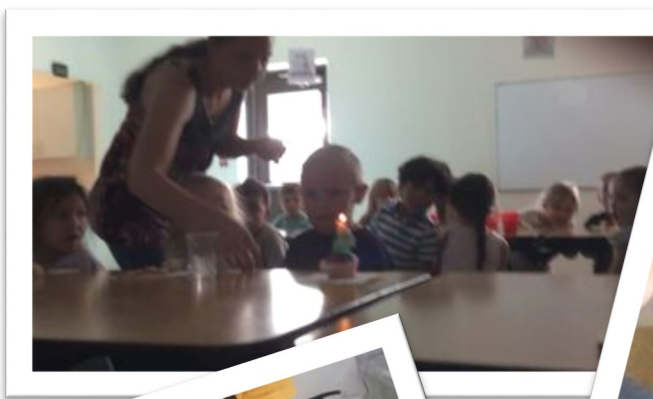
